I. Mission Statement

IV. Meetings

- **Officer Meetings:** Regular meetings for the executive board to discuss strategies, plan events, and review progress.

- **Awareness Campaigns:**
 - Special assemblies (e.g., Earth Day, World Environment Day, Van Mahotsav)
 - Quizzes, debates, essay, slogan writing, and painting competitions on environmental themes.
 - Poster making and display boards.
 - Street plays (Nukkad Natak) and rallies.
 - Creating newsletters and social media updates.
- **Green Projects/Hands-on Initiatives:**
 - Tree plantation drives within and around the school campus.
 - Cleanliness drives (school campus, local community).
 - Waste management programs: waste segregation (biodegradable/non-biodegradable), composting, setting up recycling stations (paper, plastic, e-waste, clothing).
 - Water conservation efforts (e.g., rain harvesting, minimizing water usage).
 - Energy conservation initiatives (e.g., "energy patrol" to turn off lights/appliances).
 - Establishing herbal gardens or vegetable patches.
 - Bird feeders and water for birds.
 - Making products from waste materials (e.g., paper bags, art from recyclables).
- **Educational Activities:**
 - Educational trips to nature parks, wildlife sanctuaries, recycling plants, or environmental organizations.
 - Guest speakers from environmental organizations, local authorities, or experts.
 - Workshops on sustainable living, DIY eco-friendly products, etc.

 - Maintaining a Biodiversity Register for the school campus.











- Fundraising activities (e.g., bake sales, craft sales using recycled materials).
